*Purpose*

The purpose of the symposium is to introduce and review the diagnosis and treatment options for a variety of pediatric ophthalmology entities including strabismus, amblyopia, retinopathy of prematurity, refractive errors, and pediatric eye emergencies.

*Participants*

Primary care physicians and residents, optometrists, primary care nurses, ophthalmic surgical nurses and assistants, low vision specialists, orthoptists, and ophthalmic technicians.

*Objectives*

Upon completion of the activity, participants should be able to:

- 1) Identify the normal milestones of visual development and describe the pathogenesis of the different forms of amblyopia.
- 2) Review basic techniques to evaluate visual acuity, pupillary function, ocular motility, and intraocular structures and describe current options for primary care vision screening.
- 3) Review causes of ocular redness, including conjunctivitis, corneal abrasion, preseptal and orbital cellulitis.
- 4) Specify ocular findings in Down syndrome, juvenile arthritis, myasthenia gravis, and multiple sclerosis.
- 5) Review ocular findings of retinopathy of prematurity, neonatal conjunctivitis, and congenital tear duct obstruction.
- 6) Describe the various causes and treatment approaches to esotropia, exotropia, and cranial nerve palsies.
- 7) Identify visual examples of various common and uncommon pediatric ocular problems, including leukocoria, capillary hemangioma, and congenital glaucoma.
- 8) Explain how to measure visual acuity and test for corneal abrasions, using the slit-lamp biomicroscope and the direct ophthalmoscope.
